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- i. Muck dumping = 4 dumping sites have been identified on forest land for dumping of 1,38,247.14 Metric tons of mulba.
- ii. Protection works:
  - a) The User Agency has proposed that various engineering and vegetative measures shall be taken for restoration of sites.
  - b) Retaining & Toe walls shall be provided.
  - c) Engineered lined and unlined drainage systems shall be provided near proposed dumping sites.
  - d) Requisite number of trees/ plants will be planted in order to assist the Forest Department in plantation.

## Terms and Conditions applicable

- 1. The proprietary and legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged.
- 2. The forest land shall be utilized only for the purpose for which it has been indented, that too under close supervision and periodical spot inspection of the

concerned Forest Department Officers. The report of the concerned DCF shall be submitted to the FAC Cell in the Office of Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, J&K, with copies to the Administrative Department.

- 3. The forest land shall not be mortgaged, reassigned, leased or sub-leased by user agency in any manner what so ever to any other agency.
- 4. Construction, if any approved in the proposal, will be allowed on forest land only after payment of amount summarized above is made to the Forest Department and Govt, sanction is issued in the case.
- 5. The User Agency and / or its contractors will not bring any forest area under their use other than the actual area/ activity approved by the Government for the instant proposal. Any laxity or deviation on this account by the user agency or its contractors will attract penal provisions of the relevant Acts/ legal provisions.
- 6. The User Agency has made the payment in full of the amount summarized below as reported by PCCF vide letter mentioned at Ref. (iii):-

- 7. (i) The extraction of the trees /poles shall be done by the State Forest Corporation/ Divisional Forest Officer concerned on the basis of markings administratively approved by the Chief Conservator of Forests, Jammu. The cost of extraction and transportation shall be paid by the User Agency directly to the agency executing the extraction. Marking of trees for felling purpose shall be done in consultation with the User Agency so as to save maximum number of trees.
  - ii) Fundamental rule for the marking will be to save maximum number of trees without compromising with the construction and maintenance of the approved project structures and no trees will be felled/cut/pruned//lopped for purposes/project activities other than those approved/ sanctioned

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- 8. The User Agency shall be responsible for the eco-restoration of the muck dumping sites identified on forest land through engineering and biological means. User Agency shall construct proper Retaining walls on the muck dumping sites. Muck shall be dumped in scientific manner and subsequently proper afforestation shall be done by the User Agency with the consultation of Forest Department to restore the site.
- 9. The mulba / muck shall be dumped only on the designated sites. Any damage done to the forest by the User Agency or its employees and contractors or people employed by them shall be charged from the User Agency @ 10 times the standard rate.
- 10. The forest land so allowed for use shall return to the Forest Department free of any encumbrances when it is no longer required by the User Agency.
- 11. The User Agency shall be responsible for obtaining requisite clearances under any other law in vogue before commissioning of the project.
- 12. The Divisional Forest Officer, Forest Division Kishtwar, will liase with the User Agency and shall submit a monitoring report on monthly basis on the use of forest land for muck dumping as per terms and condition of the sanction order.
