Sanction is hereby accorded to the felling of trees/poles coming in the alignment of four laning of Srinagar to Banihal Section from Km 187.00 to 189.350 (Banihal bypass and Km 220.700 to Km 286.110) as per the approved estimate of Social Forestry trees coming under alignment at Village Lasjan (Trumpet portion) Srinagar , with the other details are as under:-

Terms and Conditions:-

1. The User Agency and /or its contractors will not bring any forest area under their use, other than the actual area/activity approved by the Government for the instant proposal. Any laxity

or deviation on this account by the User Agency or its contractors will attract penal provisions of the relevant Acts/legal provisions.

2. (i) The extraction of the trees /poles/saplings shall be done by the State Forest Corporation/Divisional Forest Officer concerned on the basis of markings administratively approved by the Chief Conservator of Forests, Kashmir. The marking for tree felling will be done in consultation with the user agency and effort shall be made to save maximum number of trees/poles/saplings. The cost of extraction shall be paid by the User Agency directly to the agency executing the extraction.
- (ii) The fundamental rule for marking of trees, enumerated during processing of the proposals, will be to save maximum number of trees without compromising with the Construction and maintenance of the approved project structure and no trees / poles / saplings will be felled/cut/pruned/ lopped for purposes/project activities other than those approved/sanctioned.
3. Any damage done to the forest by the User Agency or its contractors shall be charged from the User Agency @ 10 times as per the revised standard rate of 2018 issued vide the Government Order No: 10-FST of 2018 dated: 09.01.2018.
4. The User Agency shall be responsible for obtaining requisite clearances under any other law in vogue before commissioning of the project.
