- 4. The *Compliance Report* on instructions issued in 109th FAC meeting was placed before the Committee. The Committee perused the report with further instructions as under:
 - i) With regard to proposal of special dispensation in certain matters, as has been done in LWE (Left Wing Extremism) areas by Union Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF & CC), Commissioner/ Secretary Forest Ecology and Environment will examine the same, in light of the report submitted by Principal Pr. Chief Conservator of Forests vide No. PCCF/FCA/2731/4328-29 dated: 04.08,2018.
 - ii) The instructions with regard to depicting main road to which the proposed road shall get connected stands issued vide No. PCCF/FCA/2718/4511-22 dated: 13.08.2018 and compliance is being reported by the User Agencies. It was advised that the proposals which are deferred either on account of realignment or change in forest land, the KMZ file for both the previous and the realigned roads should be placed before the FAC, for comparison and better appreciation of the decision made.
 - iii) With regard to the user agencies consulting the officers of Forest Department at the project conceptualization stage, so as to work out proposals with such an alignment that would entail minimum felling of trees and maximum preservation of flora and fauna, instructions have been circulated to all the CCFs concerned. CCF. Kashmir will place in the next FAC meeting, the correspondence by which such instructions have been circulated.
 - iv) It was observed that expenditure incurred on roadside plantation is negligible. Further, there is no such restriction that plantation should be taken up only on those roads for which forest land has been diverted. Any road side strip can be taken up for plantation to increase the tree cover. Accordingly, the Forest Department will prepare a comprehensive plan for undertaking roadside plantation, funds for which are available with the department. This will be done by 10.10.2018. Commissioner/Secretary, Forest Ecology and Environment will undertake a review of the total fund availability under various components of CAMPA and also supervise the roadside plantation efforts.
 - v) With regard to monitoring of cases from January 2010, the FAC was informed that 564 proposal were sanctioned, out of which 339 have been completed. Violation of laid down terms and conditions was reported in 18 cases, which is 3% of the total number of sanctioned forest land diversion proposals. It was advised that a list of these 18 cases shall be submitted to Commissioner/ Secretary Forests, Ecology and Environment Department, who shall examine the same and get the issues settled.

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Further, Commissioner/ Secretary Forests, Ecology and Environment shall issue instructions to all the Deputy Commissioners and Administrative Secretaries, to the effect that if there are any illegal settlements in the forest areas (i.e habitations without any proprietary rights/ land ownership), the physical and infrastructure in the form of roads, electric lines etc should not be extended to these habitations. Also, unless the project is cleared by the Forest Advisory Committee, no infrastructure project shall be undertaken for such habitations. Any violation in this regard shall be considered as violation of the J&K Forest Conservation Act.

vi) For effective and robust monitoring of works/ projects to be undertaken in Forest areas, right from the conceptual to the implementation stage on the laid down terms and conditions, the FAC approved the proposal to constitute Committees at circle level with composition as under:

i)	Conservator of Forests (Concerned)	Chairman
