While discussing the above cases, following general directions were also issued by the committee;

- I. In the õRoadside Plantationsö, a mix of local species and fast growing species should be planted.
- II. In case Muck dumping sites have been identified on the private land, the monitoring agency should ensure that site has been utilized by the User Agency. It should also be ensured that muck dumping should not obstruct the natural drainage. Ownership of the site should also be confirmed by Revenue/ Forest Department in case the same is claimed to be owned by a Private person.
- III. Requirement of õProtection Workö needs to be carefully assessed by the User Agency. The Monitoring Agency should ensure that the required length of protection work has been provided in the proposal.
- IV. A report should be submitted by the concerned DFO after the completion of the project on status of completion of all õTerms and Conditionsö as stipulated in the Government Sanction Order. Copy of report should also be placed in the meeting of FAC.
- V. The Committee directed that during the construction of project, if there is any damage, penalty clause should be invoked by the DFO concerned, invariably.
- VI. Besides the above directions, the committee directed that details of the cases in which bills which have been raised by the Forest Department for damage done by the User Agency during the execution of the project should be placed before the committee alongwith the status of the payment.
